- Completed, been waived from, or are enrolled in the MSW program's first or introductory research course (currently SLWK 609) and have not completed their second year research requirement.

SUBMIT THIS APPLICATION FORM WITH:

- A copy of your undergraduate transcript.
- Evidence of current enrollment status in the School of Social Work.
- An evaluation of your research knowledge and skill from your SLWK 609 (or equivalent) instructor.
- A brief summary (five pages or less) of your proposed second year research, a timetable for completion and anticipated research expenses for implementation. The research project proposed must be of such scope that it can be completed over the course of one academic year.

CRITERIA:

- Instructor's (SLWK 609 or equivalent) evaluation of applicants' research knowledge and skill (30 percent).
- Methodological soundness of the proposal (70 percent).

Professor Green earned a BS degree (with honors) in Psychology in 1967 and a MSW degree from the School of Social Work in 1970. He was a faculty member at the School of Social Work from 1975 until 2005 and was awarded the rank of Professor Emeritus upon his retirement. He was also very active, throughout his career, in the affairs of the Department of Psychology. He served on numerous student thesis and dissertation committees and faculty tenure and promotion committees and held a courtesy appointment in Psychology (Affiliate Research Professor) for 15 years.
