## **POLITICAL SCIENCE Major Requirements**

The Bachelor of Arts major in political science requires 33 credits in political science courses including 15 credits of core courses, 12 credits in the concentration area, and 6 additional political science credits chosen from the full list of POLI courses available. Students may count a maximum of 6 credits of internship and 3 credits of independent study toward the major. With prior approval of the departmental curriculum committee, a student may take three credits toward the political science major from courses in other departments. (For all majors, especially double majors: Be sure to check that language is completed through the 202 level.)

Accelerated Political Science/Masters in Public Administration Program: Program restricted to students who have completed 90 credits of course work and have an overall GPA of 3.0 with a GPA of 3.3 in POLI courses. If accepted, up to 12 credits undergraduate hours may be applied to the 36-hour Master Degree.
