

## PRE-OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY PROGRAM

2007-08

This advising worksheet outlines the 90 semester credit (minimum) three-year pre-occupational program requirements for application to the Master's program in the VCU department of Occupational Therapy. Completion of a B.S. or B.A. degree is not required for admission to the M.S. in Occupational Therapy program. However, in the event that students alter their plans or do not gain admission to the M.S. program, students are urged to take other courses that lead to completion of an undergraduate degree. **A "D" grade in any required classes shown on this worksheet will not be acceptable toward admission.** It is recommended that the pre-occupational therapy student select a B.S. or B.A. major in addition to the POT program sometime during the second year of study. POT is not a major leading to an undergraduate degree; it is only an advising track. In that way, if the student changes career goals from occupational therapy (or is not admitted to the M.S. program), the student may, with careful planning, graduate at the end of the fourth year in another major. All students should develop a back-up plan as early as possible. The College of Humanities and Sciences Dean's office staff will be happy to assist in the choice of the back-up major.
